The 'OUT' campaign said:

"More than a quarter of a million people came to the UK from the EU in the last 12 months – the equivalent of a city the size of Newcastle. If this continues for a decade, there will be over two million extra people."



TRUE: Over 250,000 is correct according to official estimates BUT that's smaller than Newcastle.

"Migrants affect public services"

TRUE: Immigrants add demand for public services but also contribute to paying for them.



"The EU costs us £350 million a week"

FALSE: We send £250 million to the EU. £85 million of it is spent in the UK paying for things like farmers.
